








ASWF Tying Instruction Lesson One - Hi-Tie

<p><u>Materials:</u></p>	<p>Mustad 34007, Bucktail – Three Colors (optional), Head Cement, Thread – Flat Waxed Nylon.</p>
<p><u>What is Hi-Tie?</u></p>	<p>Hi-Tie is the process successively attaching material one in front of the other. In this example we tie in Bucktail Five times. Materials can also be attached on the top and bottom of the hook shank.</p>
	<p><u>Step 1:</u> Attach Thread at hook eye, wrap to bend and then back to hook point. After each tie, optionally add a drop of head cement to each tie.</p>
	<p><u>Step 2:</u> Attach small clump of Bucktail on top of the hook shank with the butts about 1/5 of the way up from the hook bend and secure. Advance the thread just forward of the butts.</p>
	<p><u>Step 3:</u> Secure a second clump of Bucktail on top of the hook shank in front of the previous tie. Advance the thread just forward of the butts.</p>
	<p><u>Step 4:</u> Secure a third clump of Bucktail on top of the hook shank in front of the previous tie. Advance the thread just forward of the butts.</p>
	<p><u>Step 4:</u> Secure the fourth clump of Bucktail on top of the hook shank in front of the previous tie. Advance the thread just forward of the butts.</p>
	<p><u>Step 5:</u> Secure the fifth clump of Bucktail on top of the hook shank in front of the previous tie. Make sure to not crowd the hook eye.</p>
	<p><u>Step 6:</u> Finish off the head and Whip Finish.</p>

NOTES:
